Staff Movement:

- The Board expressed their deep appreciation to John Farrell for his contributions as Director of Development and the remarkable achievements he led for MCCT.
- John Farrell shared some key thoughts on which areas the board can focus on to keep the momentum of MCCT's financial progress going strengthen relationships with people who are aligned in wanting to see MCCT succeed; consider playing a more active role in fundraising with potential major donors who are excited and committed to human rights work, have an annual major fundraising event to reach out to people/ organizations who can get excited about the work we are doing and engage in a meaningful way.
- John F. also raised possible follow-through initiatives from the Elevation Campaign, e.g. Paul Austin Human Rights Award, The Next50 Years Campaign

Fundraising and Community Engagement:

• For our Senior Pastor to get a sense from the congregation what the vision is for the next 50 years, and then consider creating a campaign that is driven from within (amongst current members) and one which is externally driven e.g. corporations, foundations that want to support MCCT's work.

Technology as an enabler of connection and growth:

- James and Shannon talked about using Salesforce to its fullest potential in helping make the work easier e.g. generating phone lists, providing insights on email response rate, conversion rate, etc.
- There have been numerous complaints about calls not getting through to the right people, staff will look into why it is not working properly, and if a system upgrade is needed.
- Addressing these concerns will help improve our follow-through actions and meet the growing congregational care needs.
